A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Community of Zion,

When you are reading the Bible or listening to the passages at worship, do you ever picture in your head what it might look like? I call it making a movie in my head. I wonder what it might look like when Jesus is sleeping in the boat, talking with Nicodemus at night, or standing before Pilate.

'The Chosen' is a video series that "is a historical drama based on the life of Jesus and those who knew him. Set against the backdrop of Roman oppression in first-century Israel, the series shares an authentic look at Jesus' revolutionary life and teachings" (IMDB). It helps to visualize the story of Jesus.

You have an opportunity to see '*The Chosen*' at Zion and then have an opportunity for discussion afterwards. We will watch in the Gathering Place (on the new 65" TV) and then have a chance to discuss afterwards. People who have seen it before are welcome to watch with us or come for the discussion part. There will be two sessions, so hopefully one will fit your schedule. The sessions will be similar, but not identical, in terms of which episodes will be viewed and when.

Please Join Us on Saturday April 27th SPRING CLEAN-UP / WORK DAY!


Spring has sprung! March "showers" have brought April "weeds", so 'pick your plot' before it's taken!
